It covers an area of 18,704 square miles and shares the island of Hispaniola with its neighboring nation Haiti, which occupies 3 eights, while The Dominican Republic occupies the eastern five eights of the island. Another fact to note is that the country has a passion for baseball. This sport was introduced to the country since the 1880s and has stuck with them as a favourite sport. Also, the main religion practiced in the Dominican Republic is Catholic, which makes up 48% of the population. The country is more accessible than other Caribbean countries when coming from the United States due to the availability of more direct flights than most of its other islands.
